

# ST. ANNE'S SCHOOL 2021-22 PRE-K PROGRAM

## What are the hours of operation?

The PRE-K will follow closely with the K-8 school calendar. The school day runs from 8:15-3:00 pm. Parents can drop-off as early as 7:30 am. If you are unavailable to pick-up prior to 3:15, students will need to sign up for the after school program. PRE-K students will not be charged an additional fee for after school care. K-8 students are assessed a fee for the after school program.

## What is the tuition for PRE-K?

For the 2021-22 school year, the annual tuition will be \$5,240 for the ten-month school calendar. This can be paid monthly, all at once, or on an individualized plan. An optional summer program will be available in June and July for an additional fee. At registration, there will be additional annual fees that a normal K-8 student will have, too. Registration: \$250, Home & School: \$150, Supplies: \$30, Technology: \$50.

## What are the benefits of PRE-K?

PRE-K students will have a different schedule than our preschool students. We will offer a new curriculum set that feeds directly into the Kindergarten curriculum used at St. Anne's School. Working with our Kindergarten teacher, Mrs. Dieterle, we also focus on social/emotional skills, coordination, and age-appropriate academic skills that promote success in Kindergarten.

## Does my student have to enroll in St. Anne's Kindergarten next year to be in PRE-K?

There is no commitment to join our Kindergarten at the completion of PRE-K, however, we know that you will find value in continuing your child's education with us at St. Anne's School!

## What are the uniform requirements for PRE-K?

PRE-K students will follow the same requirement as the preschool.

## Are there any part-time spots available?

The monthly tuition will be the same regardless of how many days you decide to send your child. Your tuition guarantees a spot for your child each school day.

## Can I choose to keep my student at the preschool?

Our first priority is to fill the PRE-K with students preparing for Kindergarten. Until the slots are all full, no 4 year-olds (4 years old prior to September 1) will be enrolled in the preschool program. If a waiting list is offered, THEN we will allow older students to remain at the preschool. This allows the preschool curriculum to focus on 2-3 year old skills.
